Social policy is part of the recovery of the State's role, of the principles of solidarity, universal coverage and free delivery of key services that are viewed as public goods rather than merchandise, securing rights for effective citizenship building (education, health, social protection and security), and guaranteeing access to, and promotion of, sustainable good living spaces (housing, water and sanitation, healthy and safe environments). In the same vein, the Constitution has set the legal framework for the National System of Social Inclusion and Equity, which includes health.
